Initiatives highlighted for 2019 included plans to open two new locations and to expand our Hispanic initiative *Crece con HOPE*.

To celebrate our 25th anniversary, attendees participated in a special visioning activity during which they provided feedback about needs in our community and the role HOPE can play in the implementation of solutions. Some of the key needs mentioned were more financial education, affordable housing, and school funding. Suggestions on how HOPE could help included more policy advocacy and partnerships with cities, schools, and businesses.

- 1. Secure your hard copies by buying a safe and a shredder. Identity theft is not just a digital crime.
- 2. Examine your financial Statements to help you track your expenses and alert you to any fraudulent charges.
- 3. Choose strong passwords that vary for each device and platform.
- 4. Protect your computer with a strong anti-spyware program.
- 5. Be aware of suspicious emails and websites, especially if your browser or antivirus software warns you.
- 6. Use two-factor identification for your online accounts, such as by requiring that your phone number be verified as well.
- 7. Avoid online banking or password logins when using public Wi-Fi.
